

WHAT ARE WEEE REGULATIONS?

WEEE stands for Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment. WEEE regulations are there to regulate the disposal of Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment.

Information for consumers in the UK



Look out for this symbol!

If the symbol shown here is found on any of your goods, it means that the product may be classed as Electrical or Electronic Equipment and is covered by the WEEE Regulations which came into force in the UK in 2007.

Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment

The Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Regulations (WEEE) have been put in place to ensure that products are recycled using the best available treatment, recovery and recycling techniques to ensure human health and high environmental protection.

Through purchase of our products, you are taking on the obligation to deal with the product in accordance with the WEEE regulations.

To ensure that your product is recycled in accordance with these regulations, when you have finished with the WEEE product, you must ensure that the goods are not put in your domestic bin, but are separately disposed of by taking the waste product to your local designated collection facility. This would normally be your local civic amenity site (recycling centre). To locate your local site, contact your authority:
